Warren Buffett, the 95-year-old Chairman of Berkshire Hathaway, is regarded as one of the most successful investors of all time. His wealth, estimated at \$140 billion (ranking him among the ten richest individuals in the world), was accumulated primarily through his ownership stake in Berkshire Hathaway, which he started to acquire in 1962. He bought a controlling stake in the company in 1965 and became CEO and Chairman in 1970. Buffett turned the textile manufacturer into a financial services and industrial conglomerate with a market value of \$1 trillion, the largest non-technology company in the U.S. He stepped down as the CEO at the end of 2025.

Over the years, Buffett has earned the nickname as the “Oracle of Omaha” for his unparalleled investment wisdom as well as his profound advice in annual shareholder letters and meetings while remaining in his hometown of Omaha, Nebraska.

Buffett has inspired and even influenced us since our founding 40 years ago in 1986. We pay tribute to him via the following “20 Lessons Inspired by Warren Buffett”:

20 LESSONS INSPIRED BY WARREN BUFFETT

- 1 Read for at least a few hours every single day
- 2 Guard your time, it's the one thing you can't get back
- 3 Say no to almost everything
- 4 Know exactly what you're good at and stay inside it
- 5 Think in decades, not quarters
- 6 The simplest explanation is usually the right one
- 7 Your reputation is your most valuable asset
- 8 Surround yourself with people who have high integrity
- 9 Never stop learning. The more you know, the better you decide
- 10 Keep your emotions out of your decisions
- 11 Consistency over time beats short bursts of brilliance
- 12 Be greedy when others are fearful, fearful when others are greedy
- 13 Hire for integrity first, intelligence second
- 14 Avoid debt that funds lifestyle instead of growth
- 15 Always know the difference between price and value
- 16 The best investment you can make is in yourself
- 17 Delayed gratification is a competitive advantage
- 18 Stay rational when everyone around you is not
- 19 Build something you'd be proud of in 20 years
- 20 Live below your means, no matter what you earn
